Allocation of Places for the Papal Visit: A number of places have been allotted to each of the Pastoral Areas for the Prayer Vigil that will take place in Hyde Park on Saturday 18th September and the Mass of Beatification of John Henry Newman which will be celebrated on Sunday 19th September at Cofton Park, Birmingham. **If you wish to be considered for a place at *either one of these gatherings – not both*** - can you please indicate your intention by writing your personal details on the relevant form in the porch after Mass this Sunday. Cofton Park – Mass

The Mass of Beatification for John Henry Newman will be celebrated on Sunday 19th September, beginning at 9.30am. Each Pastoral area has been allocated **70 places** for this. The only way to travel to this will be by coach as groups must arrive together. ***People should not expect to arrive in Birmingham by car and to be admitted as individuals.*** Coaches are contracted with National Express – so our Pastoral Area will not be expected to find and book our own. The cost is £25 per person, including coach travel from every Pilgrim Point in the Diocese and a Pilgrim Pack. Our Pilgrim Point – place of departure – will most likely be Ringwood Bus Station

Hyde Park – Vigil

This takes place on Saturday 18th September, beginning in the afternoon and ending around 9pm. Each Pastoral Area in the Diocese has been allocated **100 places** for this. The expectation is that people will make use of public transport to reach London and the £10 cost per person covers a pilgrim pack, which includes a London central zone *Travelcard*.
